At the time of this writing, we are in conversation about my own transition away from First Lutheran to Rejoice! In Omaha. On a date yet to be determined, I will be leaving First to serve Rejoice! as Transitional Pastor on a full-time basis. When that assignment is concluded, I will retire from active ministry.

In the meantime, we are preparing for the season of Lent. Lent is that season where we prepare our hearts for the celebration of Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday! Our theme for Lent at First Lutheran is *Altered by the Spirit*. We will consider how our lives are changed in various circumstances by the power of the Holy Spirit. The messages on Wednesday evening will be based on the book of Acts, and the messages on Sundays will be based on the Lectionary. All messages will consider how our gracious God in Christ brings change to our lives.

It so happens that Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day this year, so we are having a service with imposition of ashes (but not communion) at noon on February 14. Our evening Ash Wednesday service will have both imposition of ashes and communion!

The next several months will be a busy time at First! We will have the usual busyness of Lent and Easter, followed by the excitement that comes with welcoming a new Lead Pastor. The spirit of Christ is at work in all of this, as First Lutheran moves into a new chapter of its mission and ministry here in Fremont.



Pledged giving was \$44k over budget in December with record high RMD contributions. Expenses were slightly under budget for December, so the month ended with a profit of \$103k. Bottom line YTD is \$91K better than budget! God is good! This will help as contributions tend to level off after the holidays. A deficit is still projected but should be less than \$100K. Building Fund contributions continue to come in to help offset costs of unexpected repairs that continue to occur as the building ages. 
Altar Flowers and Radio Broadcast:
