[In doing my research for the May 25 (Memorial Day Weekend) sermon, I came across this piece of history that should remain hidden in some dusty old library somewhere. This is real history from a time when our country was at war with itself. Note that Lincoln is not claiming God to be on our side; Lincoln was known as one who sought God's will and humbly pursued it. Perhaps we, as a nation, a community, the Church, should take a little time and ponder this.]

Whereas the Senate of the United States, devoutly recognizing the supreme authority and just government of Almighty God in all the affairs of men and of nations, has by a resolution requested the President to designate and set apart a day for national prayer and humiliation; and

Whereas it is the duty of nations as well as of men to own their dependence upon the overruling power of God, to confess their sins and transgressions in humble sorrow, yet with assured hope that genuine repentance will lead to mercy and pardon, and to recognize the sublime truth, announced in the Holy Scriptures and proven by all history, that those nations only are blessed whose God is the Lord;

And, insomuch as we know that by His divine law nations, like individuals, are subjected to punishments and chastisements in this world, may we not justly fear that the awful calamity of civil war which now desolates the land may be but a punishment inflicted upon us for our presumptuous sins, to the needful end of our national reformation as a whole people? We have been the recipients of the choicest bounties of Heaven; we have been preserved these many years in peace and prosperity; we have grown in numbers, wealth, and power as no other nation has ever grown. But we have forgotten God. We have forgotten the gracious hand which preserved us in peace and multiplied and enriched and strengthened us, and we have vainly imagined, in the deceitfulness of our hearts, that all these blessings were produced by some superior wisdom and virtue of our own. Intoxicated with unbroken success, we have become too self-sufficient to feel the necessity of redeeming and preserving grace, too proud to pray to the God that made us.

It behooves us, then, to humble ourselves before the offended Power, to confess our national sins, and to pray for clemency and forgiveness.

Now, therefore, in compliance with the request, and fully concurring in the views of the Senate, I do by this my proclamation designate and set apart Thursday, the 30th day of April, 1863, as a day of national humiliation, fasting, and prayer. And I do hereby request all the people to abstain on that day from their ordinary secular pursuits, and to unite at their several places of public worship and their respective homes in keeping the day holy to the Lord and devoted to the humble discharge of the religious duties proper to that solemn occasion.

All this being done in sincerity and truth, let us then rest humbly in the hope authorized by the divine teachings that the united cry of the nation will be heard on high and answered with blessings no less than the pardon of our national sins and the restoration of our now divided and suffering country to its former happy condition of unity and peace. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the United States to be affixed.

Done at the city of Washington, this 30th day of March, A. D. 1863, and of the Independence of the United States the eighty-seventh.

This month, 8 of the HS FLYs will be headed to Milwaukee, WI, June 22-27. Milwaukee is a diverse city that ranks 2nd in poverty among the top 50 most populated cities in the US. The main driver of the economic inequality in Milwaukee is the history of segregation and discrimination. There is a decline in manufacturing jobs, leading to high levels of unemployment. Our group is traveling with Serve Boldy, a ministry of Green Lake Lutheran Ministries. Much of the work they will be doing will be focused on helping the locals fulfill their basic needs; food and shelter. Service sites will include food pantry's, urban gardens, homeless shelters, and a pay-what-you-can cafe. Please keep this group in your prayers; that they are able to shine Christ's light to those they meet and in turn, their lives are changed for the better through this experience.

April pledged giving was \$18k below budget for the month although it remains over budget YTD and over last year. Historically, summer months will use some of these reserves but FLC should end the fiscal year on 8/31 with a positive bottom line which is much better than the negative budgeted amount. There will be some significant repair and maintenance bills coming in for the HVAC system and other building repairs which will come out of the Building Maintenance Fund. It's such a blessing to have that fund for these unbudgeted building expenses. The ice machine had to be replaced and was paid in April from the Memorials, Church Home account. Budget process for the next fiscal year starting 9/1 has started and as we all know, costs keep increasing! We continue to build the want and need list for FLC moving forward as the building ages. FLC is blessed in so many ways and thank each of you for the giving of your time, talents, and treasures.
