At the end of the Easter services, I said something I'd like to expand on a little. I said, "Easter doesn't end today." So, what does that mean exactly?

From Ash Wednesday to Good Friday, we tend to focus on ourselves, our sins, our own peril. It seems we spend all of Lent preparing for Good Friday and our role in putting Jesus on that cross, then Easter comes and Christ is risen (He is risen indeed!). Death and devil have been defeated. Yay God! Yay Jesus!

And...life goes on.

And...before you know it, it's forty days plus Sundays before the first Sunday after the first full moon after the first day of Spring. In other words, it's Ash Wednesday again, and we do it all over, again.

Don't get me wrong – Lent is important. But Christ didn't die on a cross for us to walk around guilty and ashamed all our lives. Christ rose from the grave so that we might be saved by his grace. The cross doesn't bring us hope, joy, and freedom, victory over the cross does.

So, what does it look like to live as if every day was Easter?

I imagine it looks like opening the door for everyone. It looks like not assuming the worst in people. It looks like giving up your seat for someone else. It looks like thinking of other's needs and doing what you can to make sure those needs are met. It looks like making sure everyone else has been fed before you fill your plate. It looks like generosity and hospitality and empathy all rolled into one.

I know, this is all could be scary and/or risky. What if somebody takes advantage of your grace and mercy? Isn't that what grace and mercy are all about? Grace and mercy cost Jesus his life (Good Friday) but grace and mercy didn't stop there. Easter came. The Resurrection happened.

God's grace and mercy are still working in you, in me, and in this crazy world, which means we're living in an Easter world. The resurrected Jesus is still resurrected. That resurrection means that we no longer need to fear death or the power of sin. It means we are empowered to be the resurrected Christ's hands and feet and voice to continue bringing a message of hope, peace, and love to this world, nation, and community.

So, again, what does it look like to live as if every day is Easter?

The challenge is to think outside the box, to step outside your comfort zone, to see outside your circle of influence and notice the little things you could do. Go people watching, not with the intent to criticize or judge, but with a servant's heart. Wonder what would make the world a better place for the people you see. Then do something. Be a difference maker.

Reflect on yourself and your actions. Are you willing to acknowledge your thinking could benefit from a little expansion? Is your comfort zone so comfortable you've built a wall to keep the uncomfortable out? Are you truly open to another point of view?

Good Friday saw the tomb sealed shut. Easter opened a whole new world. Do you find comfort in the darkness of the closed tomb? Or is your comfort found in the love of our Risen Lord?


Sunday Worship each week at 8:45 & 10:45 am

Once again, pledged giving was drastically stronger than last year in March with continued RMDs contributions. As a result, pledged giving exceeded budget YTD by \$84K and March ended with a profit vs the budgeted loss. YTD there is a positive bottom line that has exceeded budget by \$100K. Historically, summer months will use some of these reserves. That said, the fiscal year ending 8/31 should have a positive bottom line vs the budgeted loss. We have also had generous donors and Endowment funds to purchased new chairs for the conference room and library, office computers, ATV for yard care, Mission Center sound system, and other needed projects which we are extremely grateful for! We continue to build the want and need list for FLC moving forward as the building ages. Budget process for the next fiscal year starting 9/1 is also beginning. Wishes for a safe and fun summer!
