Let's do a thought experiment. Think for a bit on what you do everyday of the week. From the moment you wake up until the moment you fall asleep, what are you doing? Imagine a one-week calendar and fill it in with everything you do each day. Be honest. Your days will vary a little and you might not remember everything you do, but what does it look like? How full is it? Are there any empty slots? Did you put down the time you spend scrolling on your phone? Take some time and get as much of it as you can. I'll wait.

Michael Zigarelli, a professor of leadership and strategy at Messiah University, surveyed over 20,000 people from all over the world in a five-year study that ended in 2007. I know that was several years ago but I believe the data is even more relevant now. He wanted to know what obstacles got in the way of living a life with God. Can you guess what gets in the way the most?

Busyness. For men and women, all professions, and all countries, the answer was consistently busyness. Zigarelli writes,

In particular, it may be the case that (1) Christians are assimilating to a culture of busyness, hurry and overload, which leads to (2) God becoming more marginalized in the Christians' lives, which leads to (3) a deteriorating relationship with God, which leads to (4) Christians becoming even more vulnerable to adopting secular assumptions about how to live, which leads to (5) more conformity to a culture of busyness, hurry and overload. And then the cycle begins again.

What do you think? Is Zigarelli right? Is this what you see in the people around you? Does this ring true in your life? How much time with God did you put into the calendar you created in your head a few minutes ago?

No one can serve two masters, for a slave will either hate the one and love the other or be devoted to the one and despise the other. (Matthew 6:24a)

Let's try that thought experiment again, but this time be mindful of what overloads your time, what makes you hurry through your days, and what keeps you busy. What does this say about your priorities? What does this say about your commitment to God? Are you good with the results?

Six days shall work be done, but the seventh day is a Sabbath of complete rest, a holy convocation; you shall do no work: it is a Sabbath to the LORD throughout your settlements. (Leviticus 23:3)

Maybe it's time to remember the Sabbath and be intentional about taking a break from our busyness. God said it should be for a whole day each week. When is the last time you had a completely free day? When is the last time you had even 30 minutes to spend with God?

Maybe the way to break Zigaralli's cycle is to purposefully schedule God time each day. Can you do that? Can you make God a part of your busyness? It's a good place to start, and, who knows, maybe this is a seed that will grow into something more.

But you won't know if you don't plant the seed.

Wednesday "Pray-lude" Worship at 6:15 pm



Pledged giving was on budget for May and it remains over budget YTD and over last year. Historically, summer months will use some of these reserves but FLC should end the fiscal year on 8/31 with a positive bottom line which is much better than the negative budgeted amount. As noted last month, there have been some significant building expenses this year so it's wonderful to still have a positive bottom line. In May, we also paid out \$4,275 to Lutheran Disaster Response for the Lenten Offering and Meals. In July the roofing and skylight replacement project should begin. We were fortunate to earn some extra income on the insurance check to help offset the expenses. The next fiscal year starts 9/1 which means the Meeting is near.
