I noticed today that the leaves on our neighbor's tree were changing colors. Fall is my favorite season. I love the cool nights and the crisp air. I like the fall decorations – the pumpkins and mums – not the skeletons and witches. I like flannel and hot chocolate and fires with friends. Of course, there are the pies – pumpkin with whipped cream and apple al a mode. I like the smell of fall (I even like the smell of burning leaves).

Did you ever burn leaves? My childhood home had several mature trees, which meant lots of leaves, which meant lots of raking. Early in the fall, we would rake the leaves into the shape of a football field and play a game or two before the wind messed the field up. Eventually, however, all the leaves were raked into a long line along the street (not touching the street though) and we would burn them. I love that smell.

When we were in seminary, with many more mature trees and a seemingly infinite number of leaves, the campus groundskeeper would blow all the leaves into a single mountain in front of our house. He would do this on a day the kids had no school and the seminary would grant us seminarians a reading day (which meant no classes, we were supposed to take this day to catch up on our reading). We all played in the leaves – from toddlers to would-be theologians – all together, all day long.

We don't play enough anymore.

We might play *pitch* or *cribbage*, maybe *Monopoly* or *checkers*, but we don't use our imagination anymore, we aren't creative in our interactions with other people. What we now call 'play' is centered around following the rules and pre-set strategies. Now, don't get me wrong, rules and time-tested strategies are great things, but we do need to exercise our brains with creativity and imagination from time-to-time as well.

...it is God's gift that all should eat and drink and take pleasure in all their toil. (Ecclesiastes 3:13)

Who is that person you can let your guard down with? When is the last time you laughed so hard your sides hurt? When is the last time you were foolish on purpose? When is the last time you played like a child?

A cheerful heart is a good medicine, but a downcast spirit dries up the bones. (Proverbs 17:22)

Maybe that's the problem with the world right now – that we don't remember how to laugh at silliness and not at someone. Maybe we're too stuck in the rules to think of a better way. Maybe we've forgotten how to come up with our own plans. Maybe we should learn the difference between critical thinking and thinking critically.

Maybe we should give up on adulting for a while and jump into a mountain of leaves and remember what it is to enjoy what we've been given.



Pledged giving was \$20K under budget in August but ended the fiscal year \$27K over budget and \$71K over last year at this time! As a result, the fiscal year ended 8/31 with a \$6.6K profit! What a blessing considering the number of large unbudgeted expenses there were such as HVAC repairs, concrete work, gym/fellowship hall floors re-waxed, and fire panel replacement to name few. The Building Maintenance fund was also used - a good reminder of the importance of contributing to that fund! The roof and skylight invoices should be coming in the next month. Investing the money from the insurance during the planning process helped to narrow the increased costs of the new roof by \$21K!. We appreciate everyone's patience and understanding during that project. The ELC ended the fiscal year will a \$15.5K loss but with the recent tuition increase, has a budgeted profit for the new fiscal year. Happy fall to all!!
